

Beneath the Rocks

The archeological digs of the ancient Indian **VILLAGE OF TUJUNGA**



In 1945, local resident Lloyd McFee made an amazing discovery while digging in his garden. He contacted the Southwest Museum and a scientific investigation began. Archeologist Edwin Walker's findings were that McFee's garden was an ancient Native American Ceremonial Site and that a large prehistoric village was located nearby on a bluff just above the flood plain of the Big Tujunga River. Several more digs were conducted at the site and hundreds of artifacts were eventually unearthed.
