

# THE RICHFIELD BUILDING



The Richfield Building was the 1929 ZigZag Moderne masterwork by Stiles Clements located at Sixth and Flower streets in downtown Los Angeles. Demolished in 1969, it is fondly remembered as the "black gold" oil building with its great neon tower.
