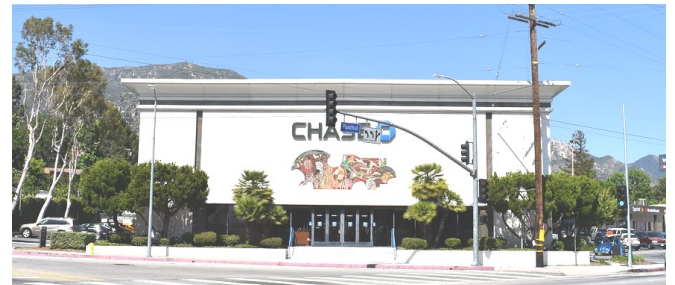

Others are familiar with his epic mosaics and sleek mid-century Home Savings buildings up and down the west coast. But few are aware of the astonishing range of work and ideas generated by this charismatic artist-designer-entrepreneur.

He not only influenced generations of artists, his own life was an almost cinematic adventure.
