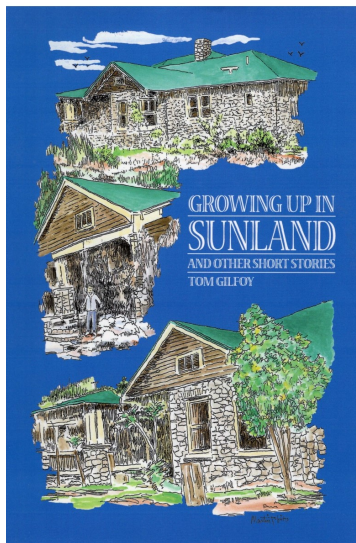
Growing Up in Sunland
