Our speaker for this program is architect and author, **Barry Schweiger** AIA, BA, MBA, RYT.

Built from 1885 to 1935, these indigenous buildings provided a new vernacular that was not to last. Eight years of research discovered these unsung and undocumented river rock homes, churches, castles, watering troughs, waiting stations and other structures. Their context, the social and economic cultures, when they were built, along with who built them, the technology and inherent strengths, enhance their stories.
