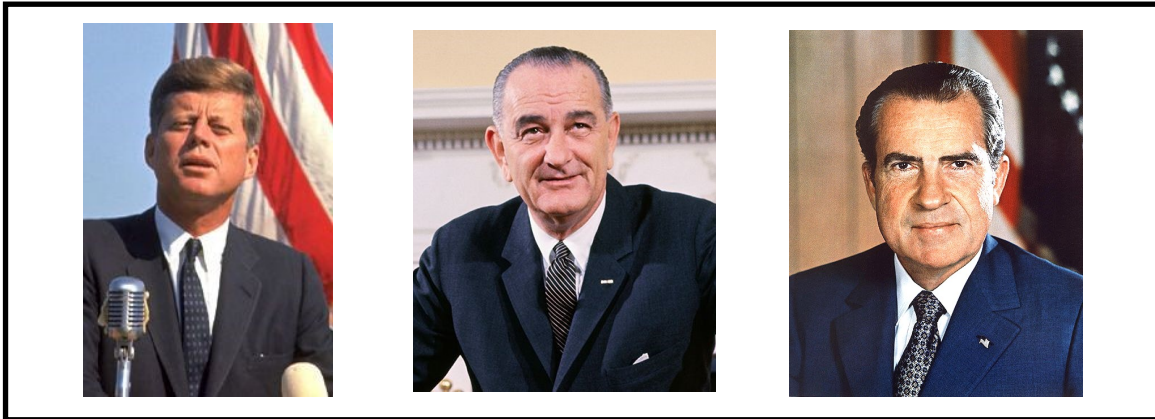


— Carl Howell —
Witnessing History

Carl Howell served as a Naval Aide to the President for three of our Presidents: Kennedy, Johnson and Nixon. When his naval service was up, he joined the Secret Service assigned to protect President Nixon in retirement. In 1985, when Nixon decided he no longer needed Secret Service protection, Carl Howell worked briefly at the Reagan Ranch.

Shy and self-deprecating, Carl recounts his adventures. As he put it, he was "a fly on the wall" witnessing some of the key turning points in American history during the 1960s and 70s. Carl's role as a naval aide was non-political; his loyalty was to the office not the person holding the office. In keeping with that spirit, this is not a political film.

John Newcombe is a local filmmaker who has presented several of his interesting and enjoyable films for us in the past. In addition to showing his film, John will recount his experience interviewing Carl Howell at his home in Shadow Hills.
